### A. Hebrews 12:14-17

We should strive to avoid becoming like Esau, who was a "profane" man because he sold his birthright for something trivial.

## B. Genesis 25:29-34

Consider the circumstances when this man gave up a great blessing from God.

#### I. HUNGER & FATIGUE AFFECT DECISION-MAKING

# A. 1<sup>st</sup> Kings 19:1-17

Elijah despaired of his life and wanted it over, so God let him rest and fed him before sending him on his next assignment.

# **B.** Matthew 4:1-4; Genesis 3:6

Remember, Satan has, more than once, tempted souls to sin with something as minor as food. It's not all about greed and sex.

# C. Genesis 2:1-3; Exodus 20:8-11

God never needed rest, but he exemplified it anyway, showing mankind that we do need it! The Sabbath law is not bound upon anyone now living, but from it we learn the need to work hard and rest before working hard again.

Let's try not to make important decisions when we are hungry, tired, or, worse, both! If we must make urgent decisions under those circumstances, let us have the wherewithal Jesus did when the devil came to Him in the desert. Furthermore, let us be patient and allow others the opportunity to rest and eat before we demand answers from them about important matters.

# A. Genesis 27:1-29; 1<sup>st</sup> Chronicles 18:12-13

# B. Proverbs 13:22; 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 12:14<sub>b</sub>

Fathers have a material duty to their children to save up and provide for them, not to deprive them of a beneficial future by wickedly short-sighted choices made in desperate moments. How many parents choose a lottery ticket instead of setting aside funds for their kids' future? How many choose bad ha

# C. Colossians 3:21; Ephesians 6:4

Fathers need to avoid angering their children, and, positively, they need to teach their children God's ways.

## III. BODILY SATISFACTION IS NOT WORTH SPIRITUAL SATISFACTION
