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Misapprehending the point Christ was making, some Christians have concluded there is nothing holy about the building in which a church assembles, so there should be no limits as to what happens in such places. That is an exaggeration resulting in unauthorized practices.

In fact, the church is holy. "Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish" (Ephesians 5:25-27). To "sanctify" is to be made holy. The word "holy" is defined by Thayer as "set apart for God, to be, as it were, exclusively His."

The church being sanctified and holy, it is a people set apart to God going about work that is also set apart to God. That work is to glorify God (Ephesians 3:21), to proclaim God's wisdom universally (Ephesians 3:10-11), being the pillar and ground of the truth (1st Timothy 3:15), to edify itself (Ephesians 4:11-16), and to relieve needy members (2nd Corinthians 9:1; 1st Timothy 5:16).

If the church and, necessarily, its work, are holy, then the facilities it acquires to fulfill that holy work are also holy - set apart to God. A church is not commanded in Scripture to own property, but if it is expedient for conducting its work, the church may do so. When a church uses its treasury, amounting from freewill offerings of the saints in first day of the week collections in church, to acquire a permanent meeting house for carrying out its authorized functions as a church, then that meeting house is holy. It is not "Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground" (Exodus 3:5) holy, but it is holy nonetheless. It has been set apart to God for the work of glorification, the work of evangelism, the work of edification, and the work of relieving saints. It does not have to be bought or built at all, but if it is, it is holy. Before it is obtained by the church, it is not holy, and after it is sold, it is not holy, but while the church possesses it, it is holy. It does not need to be fancy with stained glass or a steeple and can be quite modest and plain, but still holy - set apart to God. Therefore, it is not a place to buy and sell (John 2:13-17), neither a place to eat and drink (1st Corinthians 11:22, 34), but a place to worship, preach, encourage, and share because those are the proper missions of the church and the church is holy.

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HOLY NONETHELESS

Under the Old Testament, God had put His name in Jerusalem, specifically in the temple, the house which Solomon built Him (1st Kings 9:3). Jews understood this, but the Samaritans were people who knew to fear Jehovah, which would include worship in Jerusalem, having been instructed by Levitical priests because they occupied Israel's inheritance, yet who continued in their idolatries, regardless (2nd Kings 17:28-41). When one of them, the woman at the well in Sychar, realized Jesus was a prophet (John 4:19), she sought truth from Him concerning this matter. The Samaritan woman said, "Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship" (20). To this, Jesus replied, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father... But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth" (21, 23-24). Whereas the previous Covenant required worship in Jerusalem and Samaritans knew as much, but refused to submit, the Lord explained that, in the coming hour, there would be no particular place set for worship. Worship is in spirit and in truth, not in Jerusalem, per se.
